


What a week we have had at All Saints!

Firstly we started with reporter Tom interviewing some of us live for the breakfast show on Radio Northampton. I know some families listened to myself, Mrs Dady, Mrs Kerr and some children talk about the incredible experience and how pleased we are that we were the most successful school. Mr Chambers recorded an interview which was then played during the evening show.

We welcomed visitors and other winners into school for the prize giving and two organisations who won gift vouchers for decathlon kindly donated these to the ones we also received. This was such a lovely gesture. Whilst I was talking with them after the ceremony they said how fabulous All Saints was and what a very special place it was and they both felt that we would use the vouchers to support the children.

On Wednesday, myself and 9 other adults had the absolute pleasure of accompanying 95 children to London to perform at the O2 Arena in the Young Voices choir. I hope you all have seen the pictures on our Facebook page. What an incredible experience. I was so proud of how our children behaved throughout our coach driver said "we had been a pleasure", another school mentioned "what lovely children you have" and the security guard said "you have lovely children at your school who listen to their grown ups so well".

We will return in two years time so get prepared those of you who are currently in Years 1, 2, 3 and 4 as you will have the chance to join and sing and dance away the night. Singing is such an uplifting experience and so good for mental well being. Hearing over 7000 children singing and moving together is incredible and is a memory that will last with us all.

Thank you to those parents who have taken the time to send some lovely thank you's which I have shared with the staff, who without them giving up their free time we would not have been able to experience this.....and despite the 18 hour day were all in all bright and early the next day.

Next week sees our Year 6 children complete their Statutory tests and Year 2 start the two period in which they need to complete theirs. With Year 6 if your child feels unwell you must contact the school immediately as failure to complete one paper is an immediate fail. These tests have a very short window in which they have to be completed so it is vital that we speak to you.

The Government has not allowed any exceptions to the assessment process for any Primary aged child this year despite the significant disruption they have experienced. Academic performance is important and we strive at All Saints for successful learners. It is vital that we remember that children are only tested in Maths and English and there is so much more that children need, to be balanced all rounded individuals. Subjects such as Music and PE are not "tested" but vital to children and a crucial part of their well being so we continue at All Saints to ensure that a full and balanced curriculum is delivered.



We strive to “inspire a passion “ so this week if we have inspired one child to sing or walk as part of exercise we have achieved one of our goals. If when they are adults an individual is out walking and they share that they love it I hope they remember the time their school won “Beat the Streets” . When listening to music and perhaps singing along and sharing how much they love singing I hope they remember singing at the O2 in the Young Voices Choir. Experiences are so important and stay with us forever and we will continue, despite the constant pressure for academic achievement in tests to provide as many opportunities for our children to experience the world around us.

Finally I was delighted to receive a lovely framed letter from the organisation in Poland who distributed the items the Zietal family helped to transport to help the Ukrainian people. Your generosity was simply amazing and I know has had a direct impact on families whose lives are in turmoil. Thank you
