After a tricky day on Tuesday with the weather, yesterday we had a fabulous day. Mr Chambers had organised Sports Day with the teams in countries from the commonwealth to link this with our Jubilee celebration and yesterday these teams got to participate in a whole series of activities throughout the day.

At All Saints we believe in some key things regarding sport. They worked in mixed ability groups for their House teams overall points total. In the afternoon, the children all competed in races for which they had practiced and had been placed in one of three ability groups this enabled the children to race against others of a similar ability. Across the whole day there was something for every child and the enjoyment was evident form all.

Well done to all of those who won medals or cakes and in particular to Newton who for the first time in my 8 years at All Saints won the cup. Their amazing team performance in the tug of war I am sure made the final difference well done to everyone.

Across the week I have been auditioning children for the main parts in our whole school production "The Wizard of Oz". This takes place on Wednesday 13th July at the church and every child at All Saints from Reception upwards will be involved in some way. There will be two performances one at 1.00pm and the other at 6.00pm and tickets etc will be available for this. The confidence of our children to sing and act as part of their audition has been quite humbling to witness and my job as not been easy. It is my hope that these older pupils will inspire our younger children who in years to come will push themselves forward to audition for whatever theatrical performance is happening.

Today our children have enjoyed a giant Jubilee picnic together eating the food kindly donated by all of you. They have all been given a Jubilee book from the school and a special pin badge by the CLASS team to keep as a memory of this important chapter in English history. Crazy crowns were worn and how incredible were some of these the artistic skills are quite amazing.
