Today sees the close of the Autumn Term .....what a busy and successful one this has been. We started in September learning that we had been awarded our Gold TAMhs award (Targeted Mental Health in Schools Award) which was an incredible honour and one which reflected the hard work of Mrs Richardson. This was demonstrated in the work of our Anti Bullying team who led the special day in school when the whole community reflected on bullying and what it means and how we must prevent it.

Over the course of the term the children have participated , achieved and enjoyed so many fabulous experiences.

We have had 8 Celebration assemblies which have seen many children recognised for hard work, talent and for expressing our values. A group of children identified by their teacher were recognized for consistently showing the core values of the school and following the Golden 5 with a trip to the cinema, which was thoroughly enjoyed.

Harvest festival, Christingle and the Nativity service saw us all come together as a school and our very talented children in Year 3 and 4 entertained us with their seasonal concert. Over 80 children performed at the Castle theatre showing the wider community how brilliant and super smart the children at All Saints are. Our year 5 and 6 children shared their learning with us all and their parents with their very informative class assemblies and we look forward to next terms ones from years 2,3 and 4.

Parents and families have responded so positively to our points system with the Welcome meetings and our new style FLRM being so well attended with brilliant feedback. I was so proud of the powerpoints put together by the year 5 and 6 children ....simply amazing. FFF saw many parents supporting children with learning in Maths and with cooking and our traditional Deck the Halls afternoon was as usual very well attended.

Many visitors have been welcomed into the school with Harry and Izzy ( Head boy and Girl ) carrying out guided tours with confidence. Key Stage 2 have been treated to Felt Making and a Rocket making workshop whilst Reception and key Stage 1 watched the Rhyme and Reason show. Thank you to parents for supporting the whole school trips to the Space Centre in Leicester and the most recent outing to the Castle theatre to see the Wizard of Oz. We can provide so many activities in school which enhance the learning but trips that take children away from their comfort zones bring so much and are the things that they remember in years to come.

Developing and fostering teams and giving these teams the opportunity to work together has been important and the House Teams have worked collectively in sports, history, maths and French. 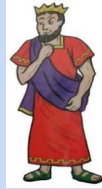
