This has been a week of celebration culminating in a fabulous assembly today which saw us recognising the amazing achievements of the children and staff. We crowned Miss Nicholls our staff "Bake off" winner, we awarded over 50 mufti tickets for Reading, shared many achievements that the children have gained outside of school and welcomed parents of the winners of Head Teachers award to share in their child's success. We announced the amazing total Newton raised for Chelsea's Angels which amounted to **£1068.51**, an incredible amount and we received a lovely letter from the Charity thanking everyone involved. Also the British Legion informed us this week that instead of the normal £70 approximately that we raise for the Poppy appeal which is very gratefully received, this year we raised an amazing **£250.42!** Again a huge thank you and especially to Izzy and Harry our Head Boy and Girl who really helped with this fundraising.

This week we also celebrated a visit from the Local Authority who carried out a monitoring visit which scrutinised the quality of Teaching and Learning, our procedures and analysed our data. Harry and Izzy conducted a comprehensive tour of the school during which the Mrs Steele met all of the class ambassadors. A brilliant job was again done by Izzy and Harry who are great representatives of the school. Mrs Steele spent a large proportion of the time with the members of the leadership team and Mr Townson our Chair of Governors. She had nothing but very positive and lovely remarks about All Saints and the staff and children who work within it.

We are also celebrating with Mrs Griffiths who has been successful in gaining a Headship at Yardley Gobion CE Primary School. Although we are very sad to be losing such a valuable, talented and integral part of our school team we are very happy for Mrs Griffiths to be successful in taking the next step in her career. I know that she will be absolutely amazing when she takes up the position after Easter and the children and staff at Yardley Gobion are certainly very lucky to have her.

This week we have appointed Mr Hunter and Miss Cheetham to the position of Assistant Head Teacher. Both of these two existing members of staff will take over when Mrs Griffiths leaves us in April. Their classroom responsibilities will not change until September to ensure continuity of learning with the children in their classes.

Next week is World Book Day which coincides with our Key Stage 2 children visiting Ironbridge, therefore it would not be appropriate to dress up etc to celebrate this day. Instead we have an author Steve Coles visiting all of the children on Wednesday and we are taking part in the the 100 million minutes reading challenge within school time. For those of you who are very crafty and creative we are running a competition which we would like all



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children to participate in. This is to take their favourite book and create a scene from that book in a shoe box. All children will be spoken to about this by their class teachers during the week and will receive a short letter detailing the time frame etc. We hope to display these wonderful creations in the library.

Those of you who have popped into the office this week may well have spotted our Admin Team wearing their fabulous uniforms. Don't they look smart?

Calling All Knitters! – Children, Mum’s, Dad’s, Grandparents

For the service to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the consecration of All Saints Church, 20th May 2018, there is an ambition to cover the pillars in a riot of knitted, coloured flowers. To achieve the desired look hundreds of flowers will be needed and we at All Saints CEVA Primary would like to make our contribution. The more people who can make a few the more we can give!



The pattern is below, it is simple so even beginners should be able to have a go. Flowers are required for the beginning of May at the church, but they can be sent into school at any time and we will collect them here.

- Cast on 120 Stitches
- Knit 4 rows
- Next row. Slip 1, knit 2 together, pass slip stitch over – repeat until the end of the row (40 stitches)
- Next row. Knit 2 together – repeat until the end of the row (20 stitches)
- Knit 4 rows
- Next row. Knit 2 together – repeat until end of row (10 stitches)
- Cut of wool, thread through remaining stitches and pull tight. Slip stitch the edges together.

They can be any colour, and any size yarn – remember to use a needle size appropriate to your yarn thickness.
